I know Kathy would like to end up in Rockville, Indiana at her favorite Five & Dime Store to purchase some greeting cards and gifts.

Indiana, known as the Covered Bridge Capital of the world, has an abundance of covered bridges, each one unique with an interesting history. When we relocated to the Midwest, Kathy and I were introduced to the bridges in Parke and Putnam Counties on a fantastic tour with the Suzuki Cavalcade Riders.

When we lived in Pennsylvania, there was one particular covered bridge that became very special to the members of my family. We had moved to the Pocono Mountains. We had the option of using the Pennsylvania Turnpike when traveling south **or** we could go through the covered bridge at Little Gap and ride over Blue Mountain to reach our destination. Of course, we chose the scenic route. The bridge was on the way to the Lehigh Valley and beyond. It became a constant reminder of the One who said, I am the Way, the Truth and the Life: no one comes to the Father but by me." John 14:6

The bridge's location, Little Gap, Pennsylvania, also caused us to reflect upon God's great mercy. Think of the gap, the great chasm between God and mankind. Jesus Christ provided the bridge to God on Calvary's Cross. The hymn writer, W.R. Newell penned these words:

"Oh the love that drew salvation's plan!

Oh the grace that brought it down to man,

Oh the mighty gulf that God did span – AT CALVARY!"

The bridge at Little Gap is constructed of wood. Our thoughts turn to the "Old rugged Cross" where Jesus died in our place. "God made Him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God." 2 Corinthians 5:21.

Jesus became our substitute on the cross. His was a death you and I deserved to die; He took our guilt and nailed it to the cross so that we might be forgiven and rise to new life through Him. If you haven't invited Him into your heart and life, I would urge you to do it now.

It is also significant that the bridge is covered to protect the trusses from deterioration from the elements. The practice of covering bridges was said to increase the life of the bridge to well over one hundred years with a minimum of repairs. The Psalmist wrote, "Blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered." Psalm 32:1

God's forgiveness is not limited to the life of a bridge; it lasts for all eternity!

When you are out riding and come upon a covered bridge, may it be a reminder of what

the Lord has done for us. Kathy and I pray you will be blessed as you contemplate Jesus' sacrifice on the Cross of Calvary and reflect upon the reality of the Resurrection.
