
pastor, Larry Kurtz, gave everyone a copy of the one pictured here.

The early theologians like Augustine and John Chrysostom said that God had played a joke on the devil by raising Jesus from the dead. They called it "Risus Paschalis" the Easter laugh.

God identified with human need and suffering, and the cross declares that God took all the sin and shame and dealt with it once and for all in Jesus' death. Paul put it this way, "God made Him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God." (2Corinthians 5:21 KJV)

We will never fully understand the cross in this life; it is a mystery. God does not require us to understand it, but to experience it. He died as our substitute that we may be forgiven. We know that it is God's way of salvation and it has changed the lives of millions.

If you have not asked Jesus into your heart and life, I would invite you to do it today.
