Dear friends,

The joy of hearing about weddings, new babies, and the fantastic scenic rides they have taken during the year is always special. As the song goes, "It's the Most Wonderful Time of the Year!"

In the Bible in Luke 2:8 we read, "And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the fields, keeping watch over their flocks by night."

How wonderful and thoroughly remarkable that the Good News of Jesus' birth was first announced to the shepherds! To ordinary working people. Not the kings, not the priests, not the scribes nor the Pharisees, but it was to the shepherds, simple men of the fields that God's message first came!

In an Advent study, several years ago, the pastor at our home church here in Indiana asked which of the characters is the Nativity story we most related to. The responses were varied. Kathy and I shared that because of our ministry to motorcyclists, we felt a special bond with the shepherds.

Let's take a minute or two and think about those first-century Palestinian shepherds and what the biker might have in common with them. First of all, they were stereotyped as being a rather "rough crowd" with a poor reputation. The stereotypical biker is aware of being looked down on or snubbed simply because of his mode of transportation. Shepherds were considered unreliable. The general feeling of the time was that they were OK to tend your sheep, but you wouldn't want your daughter to marry one of them.

Because of the nature of their work, they were unable to keep all the details of ceremonial laws; they couldn't observe all the meticulous hand washings and rules and regulations. Most of the time they were ceremonially unclean and were excluded from worship services in the Temple. After riding our bike in the rain, dust, storms etc., we have had the feeling of being a bit "ceremonially unclean" ourselves. Just as the shepherds were misunderstood by the religious folk of their day, there are times when motorcyclists are somewhat misunderstood by the "respectable people" of our day, the mainstream of society. But take heart, it was to the shepherds that the angel of the Lord spoke that night. And it was the shepherds who first spread the message of the Christ Child. They were our first evangelists!

Today, the Lord still speaks to ordinary people like us and, yes, He even uses people like you and me to spread the Good News of Jesus, the Lamb of God who takes the sin of the world.

Christmas isn't about candy canes, or lights all aglow, it's the hearts that we touch, and the care that we exhibit.
