"Have you any room for Jesus, He who bore your load of sin?
As He knocks and asks admission, Will you let Him in?
Room for Jesus, King of glory! Hasten now, His Word obey.
Swing your heart's door widely open, bid Him enter while you may."

Remember to check out your favorite motorcycle website. Keep checking it for biking events and activities that you can attend and let your light shine for Jesus. If you've already given up your motorcycle, go anyway. You don't have to straddle that saddle to be a blessing! Reflect His love for all those around you.
