Many years ago, at Frankford High School in Philadelphia, PA, my tenth-grade English teacher, Mr. Charles Hackenyos, gave me three worthwhile tips on enjoying the small things in our lives. They're simple, at least they sound that way: slow down, set time aside to reflect, and start a gratitude journal. Sometimes my journal would put a big grin on his face.

Mr. Hackenyos was not only a good English teacher, but he was also an accomplished musician and fantastic organist. He served as organist and music director at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Mayfair in the 1960s and 70s. He also played the organ at Wanamaker's Department Store in downtown Philadelphia. The first time I went to Wanamaker's with him, I felt like I was on a cloud floating in the center of the store, above the grand foyer, looking down at the customers, and listening to the music. That was a thrill and a joy!

I have found being alert to all the small pleasures of our day is a way to build joy. This is needed more than ever because we seem to live in an increasingly negative world. It's not easy; my mind often drifts. But I found something as simple as listening to a bird sing can reset my mind and bring a smile to my face. I don't know what it is about a little bird that is so magical for me.

There are many things in nature that bring me joy. Seeing a sunset or a sunrise, or just sitting in front of the ocean and listening to the waves. However, I bet that you would get a smile as big as mine when you hear what I do with Merlin's excess food. I take his dish and open the door to my patio and dump his food bowl on the ground beyond my door. You would not believe the number of birds at approximately 10:00 (Merlin's feeding time) each day that come down and gobble up all that I throw out there. There are big birds and little birds, sparrows, pigeons, starlings and crows, and they don't leave anything behind.
